8) Project Description:

General Description: The Duncan Chapel Fire District is in the process of transitioning from a Basic Life Support (BLS) first response/rescue agency to an Advanced Life Support (ALS) first response/rescue agency.

This project will help us with this transition by procuring a necessary piece of ALS equipment. The project involves purchasing a dual function biphasic defibrillator. One that can be used as an AED or as a manual defibrillator with ALS features such as capnography . Without such a device, our certified ALS personnel are limited in their scope of practice to BLS skill sets.

Benefit project will provide the Community: Greenville County EMS currently provides ALS transport services to the Duncan Chapel Fire District area and utilizes our station as a priority post. However, with the high volume of EMS calls experienced in the county, Greenville County EMS is not always present when the calls come in. The upgrade in service level will afford the District the ability to provide non transport advance care to our residents and visitors to the District. With Furman University residing in the heart of the District and hosting several large events with thousands of attendees every year we have an obligation to provide the best possible service that we can afford to our residents, visitors and passers-by.
