The Greenville County Redevelopment Authority (GCRA) Board and staff is requesting approval of the 2013 Annual Action Plan Budget that will be presented at County Council's Finance Committee. Greenville County is required to submit to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) the planned uses of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Partnership, and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds that will be allocated to the County beginning July 1, 2013. HUD requires all communities receiving federal block grants to submit an Annual Action Plan of the uses of the funding by May 15, 2013. The Annual Action Plan also includes Greenville County's goals for providing affordable housing and to improve communities.

I am requesting that this item be placed on the agenda for approval by the Finance Committee. Approval of this item is required by Council for submission to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development by May 15<sup>th</sup> 2013. 
#### 2013 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN




### Greenville Count Redevelopment Authority Program Year 2013 Annual Action Plan Budget




### City of Fountain Inn: Council District 27 Program Year 2013 Annual Action plan Budget of \$119,920






