AFFIDAVIT OF FAMILY SUBDIVISION

I further acknowledge that I have been advised that the Greenville County makes no representations concerning the suitability of this land for the intended purpose, particularly with regard to those matters that would be disclosed through the normal permitting procedure in place in Greenville County. I understand that the resulting lot development must comply with all applicable local, state and federal requirements; including, but not limited to, stormwater management, flood damage prevention, and wastewater disposal regulations, prior to building permits being issued .
