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Use of Investment*

How will your organization utilize the investment made by the Petco Foundation, if granted?

In 2014, only 0.009% of the stray cats entering the Greenville County shelter were returned to their owners, and ultimately 53% of the 9,300 cats that entered were euthanized. Community Cat diversion will be a crucial life-saving tool for the Greenville County community to reach a 90% or higher live release rate. Rather than continuing practices that do not yield much progress, Greenville County Animal Care plans to target the solution and stop the reproduction cycle of outside cats.

Because the population at greatest risk are cats entering through the shelter doors, the bulk of the funding requested will be used to implement a Community Cat Diversion Program to sterilize, ear tip, and vaccinate all outside cats that enter the shelter, and then return those cats to the area from where they came.

It is estimated that up to 85% of the cat population entering shelters are outside cats and eligible for community cat diversion (source: Target Zero). For Greenville County Animal Care, that equates to approximately 7,300 eligible cats that can be spayed or neutered, ear tipped, vaccinated, and returned to their outside homes.

The cost for Greenville County Animal Care's high volume, low-cost spay/neuter clinic to perform 7,300 additional feline sterilization surgeries each year is estimated at \$158,000. This assumes the clinic will spend, on average, \$21.67 per cat to spay or neuter, ear tip, and vaccinate (FVRCP and Rabies).

Additionally, Greenville County Animal Care wants to offer FREE spays and neuters to citizens in the the community who are actively engaged in feral cat TNR to further reduce the number of community cats and especially kittens entering the shelter each year. The clinic's capacity for public feral cat TNR is 800 cats per year. The cost to spay or neuter, ear tip, and vaccinate 800 feral cats will be approximately \$17,000.

In total, Greenville County Animal Care is requesting \$175,000 in funding to start up these programs. It is believed that by implementing these two life saving options for cats, Greenville County will successfully achieve a 90% or higher live release rate by the end of 2015.

To sustain the Community Cat Diversion Program and continue to offer FREE spays and neuters to citizens actively engaged in feral cat TNR, Greenville County Animal Care plans to solicit the community for donor support. As these programs mature, fewer and fewer county funds will be needed to house, care for, and make adoptable the sheer number of cats entering the shelter currently. These funds can then be diverted to sustain these two life-saving programs. Greenville County Animal Care believes that it will successfully build a strong donor base and will be able to divert the necessary county funding in place to sustain these programs long-term within a 3-year period. Greenville County Animal Care therefore seeks funding for one year of financial support to implement the suggested programs and also requests that the Petco Foundation will consider funding a second and third year as the shelter is able to show success with the life-saving efforts these programs traditionally yield.

Greenville County Animal Care became a Target Zero fellow in December 2015, and is diligently working to implement the proven strategies to achieve a 90% or higher live release rate and the status of a "no-kill community". Additionally, Greenville County Animal Care has been selected as one of the Key Resource Centers for the No-Kill South Carolina project and will be working with Charleston Animal Society and other South Carolina animal welfare agencies to help achieve the goals of that Petco Foundation funded project.

Dr. Sara Pizano and Cameron Moore of Target Zero, and Joe Elmore of Charleston Animal Society have all encouraged Greenville County Animal Care to apply for a Petco Foundation grant with the purpose of increasing life release rates at the Greenville shelter and furthering its success to achieve a No Kill Greenville County.

Greenville County Animal Care operates a state-of-the-art spay and neuter clinic that was designed to and is capable of performing these additional surgeries. Dr. Sara Pizano and Cameron Moore from Target Zero has evaluated the clinic's capacities and agrees with this statement.

Greenville County Animal Care is the only open admission shelter in Greenville and Spartanburg counties. Historically, the shelter takes in 20,000 animals each year. Yearly intake numbers are steadily decreasing with the implementation of surrender prevention, spay/neuter, and other strategies aimed at lowering shelter intake. In 2015, the shelter intake was just over 17,000. Greenville County Animal Care holds ALL animal control contracts with municipal agencies in Greenville County as well as the contract with Spartaburg County to house and care for their county's stray animals.

In 2007, when Greenville County Animal Care began its operations, the local humane society (who at the time was operating the open admission shelter) was reporting a live release rate of 15% or less. Within it's first year of operation, Greenville County Animal Care increased it's live release rate to 59% and has slowly but steadily increased that rate over the years to its current 64% live release rate. The challenge has always been finding life-saving options for cats entering the shelter. With the implementation of a Community Cat Diversion Program, the plateau that this community has been experiencing will end and allow Greenville County to achieve and experience a 90% or higher live release rate for the first time ever in its history. It will also place this state one giant step closer to becoming a No-Kill South Carolina.

One item to note on our spay/neuter statistics. You will notice our "total number of spay/neuter surgeries during the year funded by your organization (all types)" is 6,090, yet the other figures given equal 8,498. This is because some of the surgeries performed in Greenville County Animal Care's spay/neuter clinic are not funded by our organization, but by other non-profit organizations (Speak for Animals, for example, offers vouchers to the public that they can use at our clinic). Knowing how important it is for the data to match up in this application, we wanted to make this clear as to why it may appear as a math discrepancy.
