# (b) Waste Tire Ordinance Amendment

**ACTION:** 

Councilor Dill moved for adoption at third reading an ordinance to amend Section 3 of Ordinance No. 4771, regulating the storage of used and/or waste tires, to provide that used tires for resale may be stored outdoors on lots greater than two acres in size, provided the tires are stored in the rear yard, and enclosed and screened from view on all sides.
