CALL TO ORDER

Councilor Meadows called the Finance Committee meeting to order.

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APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Councilor Norris moved to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of July 16, 2019. The motion carried unanimously.

SALE OF PROPERTY – RIVER ROAD:

This is an ordinance authorizing the sale and transfer of five parcels of real property owned by the Greenville County Sheriff's Office on Lake Cunningham located at 1020, 1020-A, 1022, 1022-A 1024 and 1024-A River Road. The purchase price is \$187,000 and the funds will return to the Sheriff's Office Drug Seizure Account.

Shannon Herman, Assistant County Administrator was present to answer questions of the committee.

Councilor Kirven moved to approve the ordinance authorizing the sale and transfer of five parcels of real property owned by the Greenville County Sheriff's Office on Lake Cunningham located at 1020, 1020-A, 1022, 1022-A 1024 and 1024-A River Road at a purchase price of \$187,000 to Randy Hanson. FOOTHILLS FIRE SERVICE AREA – CONTINUATION OF CURRENT MILLAGE:

This a resolution that provides for continuation of To approve the continuation of the current total millage rate of 23.1 and to authorize the reallocation of the 7.3 Prior Year Deficit millage as follows: (a) five-tenths (0.5) mill to the base millage which equates to the millage cap as allowed per Section 6-1-320(A) of the SC Code of Laws, and (b) six and eight-tenths (6.8) mills to the maintenance of a reserve millage as allowed per Section 6-1-320(D). The action realigns the current millage and represents no increase is taxes.

Richard Locke, Commission Chair, Foothills Fire Service Area and John Hansley, Deputy County Administrator were present to answer questions of the committee.

Councilor Cates moved to approve the resolution for the continuation of current ad valorem property tax to be levied by the Foothills Fire Service Area at 23.1 mills. The motion carried unanimously.
