PROGRAM NARRATIVE – ATTACHMENT 1**

LAW ENFORCEMENT AND JUDICIAL SUPPORT ENHANCEMENTS

Greenville County government is seeking a grant in the amount of \$118,122 for the objective of enhancing and continuing programs established in law enforcement and judicial support areas of the County. The primary goal of this project is to improve and/or augment services provided to the citizens of Greenville County by the law enforcement and judicial departments within the county government. **Law Enforcement and Judicial Support Enhancements** will provide for supplies for the Forensics Division, equipment for the Detention Center Medical Division, equipment for the Sheriff's Office, and contractual funding for the continuation of the adult and juvenile drug court programs administered through the Solicitor's Office.

Upon award of grant funds, the County will acquire equipment, supplies, and services through the County's approved procurement process. All equipment is anticipated to be acquired and/or implemented within the first year of the project period. Once equipment is received by the County, any old equipment that is being replaced will be removed and disposed of and new equipment will be immediately installed. Training for equipment will occur immediately after the equipment is installed. The acquisition of contractual services will be an ongoing purchase throughout the project as long as funds remain.

The County's Office of Management and Budget will be responsible for coordination of all progress and financial reports of the grant. Reports will be submitted according to the Department of Justice guidelines.

The project identifiers for the proposed grant activities are:

1. Forensics Science
2. Drug Courts
3. Equipment - General

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY – FORENSIC DIVISION

The Department of Public Safety Forensic Division is requesting \$34,374 in support of law enforcement services. The funds will be used for forensic supplies and operational items. Operational support of the Forensic Division will include the purchase of chemicals, supplies and operational items for all sections. Identified items and supplies will be utilized by the Drug Lab, Firearms Lab, Crime Scene Section, Latent Print Section, and Property and Evidence Section.

Project Goals include (1) provide operational support of the Forensic Division to include the purchase of supplies to maintain accreditation standards.

Objective 1: Provide operational support of the Forensic Division Laboratory.

Performance Measure: List of supplies purchased with location and purpose.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY – MENTAL HEALTH DIVISION

The Department of Public Safety Medical Division is requesting \$5,000 in support of Detention Center medical care for inmates. The funds will be used for the purchase of 1 Butterfly Point of Care Ultrasound Device (POCUS). This device provides a precise, cost-effective and noninvasive diagnosis that carries no risk of ionizing radiation. It determines the health state of both emergent and stable patients and improves patient care and safety. It will improve the standard of care provided by the Detention Center's Advanced Providers. The benefits of having one of these devices at the Detention Center would be to aid in assessment of fluid status, cardiac and pulmonary evaluations, OBGYN, abdominal assessments, evaluation of renal colic. Additionally, medical staff would be able to assess quickly for solid organ injury related to trauma (i.e., altercations) and assist in procedures such as incision and drainage. POCUS can be very effective during a mass casualty incident at the Detention Center. They allow healthcare professionals to obtain a precise idea about field triage and patient care conditions.

Project goals include (1) purchase a Butterfly Point of Care Ultrasound Device (POCUS) to provide better care for the inmate population.

Objective 1: Purchase device as listed above.

Performance Measure: List of equipment with licenses, location, and purpose and document training of new system with advanced providers.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE

The Sheriff's Office is requesting \$39,374 to acquire equipment, including gas masks and filters and vest covers (outer carrier with specified gear pouches). Project goals include acquiring the necessary equipment for the Sheriff's Office.

SOLICITOR'S OFFICE - DRUG COURT

The Solicitor's Office is requesting \$39,374 for the continuation of the Adult and Juvenile Drug Court programs. The funding will be used for contractual services for drug testing and counseling services.

The Adult Drug Court is a multi-phase program that incorporates intensive substance abuse treatment, judicial supervision, and random drug testing. The program targets nonviolent offenders charged with felony drug or drug related crimes. Referrals to the program must be approved by the Solicitor's Office. The defendant must be diagnosed with a substance abuse disorder. If deemed eligible, offenders must plead guilty in Court and a sentence will be imposed. The sentence will be suspended under the condition that the offender completes the Drug Court program. Each phase of the program requires individual, group, and family therapy sessions as well as community support groups. Upon entering the program, counseling and drug testing requirements are intense. As the participant demonstrates progress by completing treatment goals, the participant is advanced to the next phase of the program. Successful completion of the program will result in the satisfaction of the sentence.

The Juvenile Drug Court is a multi-phase program that incorporates intensive substance abuse treatment, judicial supervision and random drug testing. The program targets non-violent juvenile offenders between the ages of 12-16 with a substance abuse diagnosis. All referrals must be approved by the Solicitor's Office. The program lasts a minimum of 12 months. Each phase of the program requires individual, group, and family therapy sessions as well as community support groups. Upon entering the program, counseling and drug testing requirements are intense. As the participant demonstrates progress by completing treatment goals, he/she is advanced to the next phase of the program. Program requirements are gradually decreased as the participant moves to the next phase. In

the event that the participant fails to adhere to the program requirements, increased judicial supervision and incarceration are used as sanctions at the recommendation of the staff. Successful completion of the program will result in the dismissal of the charge(s). Non-compliance with program requirements will result in the offender returning to court for prosecution. Funding will be used for drug testing and payments for counseling services and weekly group sessions.

The project goal is to increase the number of graduates from each program.

Objective 1: Increase graduates from each program.

Performance Measure: Number of applicants accepted into the program, number of successful completions.
