Dear Mr. Stenson:

This approval responds to your request to modify the approved Scope of Work (SOW) to add 11 additional properties to the above referenced project. We have reviewed your request in accordance with current HMGP program guidance and have approved the activities as follows:

Phase I that will include the acquisition of all 11 properties, with the demolition of the following 3 properties:

The remaining 8 properties will not be demolished until compliance with NHPA has been documented and Tribal consultation is completed. Upon the conclusion of the Section 106 environmental process, you will receive notification from FEMA to proceed with Phase II and completion of the project. Phase II will result in the demolition of the following 8 properties:

FEMA will not establish activity completion timeframes for individual sub-awards. Recipients are responsible for ensuring that all approved activities are completed by the end of the award's period of performance (POP). The DR-4166 POP ends no later than March 11, 2021. The State must submit all financial, performance, and other reports required as a condition of the award prior to June 10, 2021. This project must adhere to all HMGP program regulations, guidance, and policy, including the following conditions:

Any change to the approved scope of work will require re-evaluation for compliance with NEPA and other Laws and Executive Orders.

This review does not address all federal, state and local requirements. Acceptance of federal funding requires recipient to comply with all federal, state and local laws. Failure to obtain all appropriate federal, state and local environmental permits and clearances may jeopardize federal funding.

If ground disturbing activities occur during construction, applicant will monitor ground disturbance and if any potential archeological resources are discovered, will immediately cease construction in that area and notify the State and FEMA.

CZMA: The subgrantee is responsible for obtaining any required SCDHEC-OCRM Coastal Zone Management permits/waivers. Compliance with the requirements constitutes compliance with SC CZC. Failure to comply with these conditions may jeopardize FEMA funding; verification of compliance will be required at project closeout.

RCRA: Unusable equipment, debris and material shall be disposed of in an approved manner and location. In the event significant items (or evidence thereof) are discovered during implementation of the project, applicant shall handle, manage, and dispose of petroleum products, hazardous materials and toxic waste in accordance to the requirements and to the satisfaction of the governing local, state and federal agencies.

RCRA: If any asbestos containing material, lead based paint, and/or other toxic materials are found during construction activities, the applicant must comply with all federal, state and local abatement and disposal requirements. Upon closeout, the applicant must provide Notice of Demolition or Asbestos Renovation forms and confirmation that any asbestos containing materials were taken to an authorized landfill for such materials.

We concur with your request to modify the Scope of Work to add the additional 11 properties. We understand that the federal share increased in the amount of \$1,061,996.61. According to the documentation, the method for the completion of the grant is the same as what was originally submitted and approved with an exception of the above modification to the SOW. Any changes to the approved scope of work will require submission, evaluation and approval, prior to initiation of any work.
