Two schools within the district: Fork Shoals Elementary & Ralph Chandler Middle School, Two SCDOT major feeder roads: Highway 418 with 9,500 AADT per SCDOT 2021 data, Fairview Road (418 to Harrison Bridge Road) with 10,500 AADT per SCDOT 2021 data, Fairview Road (418 to Tall Pines Road) with 4,100 AADT per SCDOT 2021 data.

Two major pipelines run through our district: Colonial Pipeline

We provide mutual aid to Dunklin and support medical calls in their district, providing basic life support responses. Mutual aid agreements with Fountain Inn, Simpsonville, South Greenville, Green Pond

The addition of personnel will allow for more firefighters on the scene quicker with apparatus. This increase will also allow for the updating of older equipment.

Priority 1: Without the increase, we cannot continue to provide the level of service that we are giving currently. Our ISO ratings could be affected negatively. The need is dire.

Priority 2: Without the increase, we cannot purchase needed equipment to improve the level of service we are currently giving. ISO ratings may or may not be improved. This priority level also allows for needed specialty equipment to be acquired.

Priority 3: Without the increase, we can continue to provide excellent service to our district, but the increase will allow us to improve our operation in an exemplary way. ISO ratings may potentially be improved.

*Currently we are down 1 employee and unable to hire a replacement due to budget constraints. Aging equipment, unable to purchase Cascade system to refill SCBA tanks and not enough turnout gear for all employees puts our district at risk.
