




# OUR COUNTY






#### **15% OF OUR BRIDGES ARE LOAD-RESTRICTED** OR CLOSED.

- 13 CLOSED OR RESTRICTED




# **ROAD PROJECTS**

**0 OF 75 PROJECTS FROM A** 2014 REFERENDUM HAVE BEEN COMPLETED. 4 ARE UNDERWAY.


21 OF 182 GPATS PROJECTS IN Greenville County will be Funded by 2045.

COST TO REPAIR POOR AND FAIR Condition Roads: \$2 Billion




