Whereas, his tireless efforts have significantly improved the aesthetics of Howell Road and safeguarded the surrounding environment by preventing litter from entering our waterways; and


Whereas, Mr. Goucher is a true inspiration. His unwavering passion and dedication serve as a testament to the impact a single individual can make on our community.
