Item (7) Public Hearings

a. Lake Cunningham Fire District / Millage Request

A public hearing was held for the purpose of receiving comments from the public regarding a resolution to provide for the millage rate to be levied by the Lake Cunningham Fire District.

b. Mauldin Fire District Millage

d. Greenville / Pickens Multi County Industrial Business Park Agreement – Commerce Park

A public hearing was held for the purpose of receiving comments from the public regarding an ordinance to develop a jointly owned and operated industrial/business park in conjunction with Pickens County pursuant to South Carolina Code of Laws 1976, Section 4-1-170 as amended, such industrial/business park to be, at the time of its initial development, geographically located in Pickens County and to include certain property comprising the Pickens County Commerce Park and additional property within Pickens County located on Cartee Road; to provide for a written agreement with Greenville County providing for the expenses of the park, the percentage of revenue application, and the distribution of fees in lieu of ad valorem tax; and matters related thereto.

i. CZ-2024-022. Property of Soltyz Inc. located at 107 Page Drive and White Horse Road, Greenville, requesting rezoning from S-1 to FRD with a condition.

iii. CZ-2024-030, Property of Daryl Renshaw, located at 103 Alco Street and Hallcox Street, Greenville, requesting rezoning from R-12 to R-6. The Planning Commission and the Committee recommended approval.

On behalf of the Committee, Councilor Fant moved approval of the ordinance at second reading.

iv. CZ-2024-032, Property of JP Alliance LLC, located at 253 Roberts Road, Taylors, requesting rezoning from R-12 to R-M2. The Planning Commission and the Committee recommended denial.

b. Project Anchorage / Fee in Lieu of Tax Agreement

Chairman Pro Tem Kirven moved for approval at second reading an ordinance authorizing the execution and delivery of a fee in lieu of tax agreement by and between Greenville County, South Carolina and a company known to the county at this time as Project Anchorage, with respect to certain economic development property in the county, whereby such property would be subject to certain payments in lieu of taxes, including the provision of certain special source credits; and other matters related thereto.

a. Capital Projects Sales Tax Referendum Ordinance

Councilor Seman presented for first reading an ordinance enacted pursuant to the Capital Project Sales Tax Act, Title 4, Chapter 10, Article 3 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended, providing for the imposition of a one percent sales and use tax upon referendum approval; the form of the ballot to be used in connection therewith; the authorization of the issuance of general obligation bonds of Greenville County, subject to such referendum, to defray costs of projects and issuance costs; and other matters relating thereto.
