

A RESOLUTION

TO ENLARGE THE BOUNDARIES OF THE GREATER GREENVILLE SANITATION DISTRICT TO INCLUDE 618 S. PARKER ROAD.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Title 6, Chapter 11, Article 3 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended (the “*South Carolina Code*”), the governing bodies of the several counties of the State are authorized to enlarge, diminish or consolidate any existing special purpose districts created prior to March, 1973 that are located within such counties; and

WHEREAS, Greenville County Council is the governing body of Greenville County, South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Greenville Sanitation District (the “*District*”) was created by Act No. 1543 of the 1968 Acts and Joint Resolutions of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, as amended, and is authorized to collect refuse, garbage and trash within and outside the District; and

WHEREAS, a petition has been submitted to Greenville County Council by the owner of 618 S. Parker Road, Greenville, SC 29609 (TMS# 0456000100309) (the “*Property*”), to have the Property annexed into and made a part of the District.

WHEREAS, the Greater Greenville Sanitation District Commission has consented to the annexation of the Property into the District; and

WHEREAS, Greenville County Council finds that the Property is located wholly within the boundaries of Greenville County, South Carolina, and is not located within any special purpose district or municipality empowered to provide trash collection and expansion of the boundaries to include the Property will provide for the orderly collection of refuse, garbage and trash within the District; and

WHEREAS, Greenville County Council finds that it is in the public interest that the boundaries of the District are enlarged to include the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Greenville County Council that the boundaries of the Greater Greenville Sanitation District are hereby enlarged to include the Property, and that pursuant to S.C. Code § 6-11-470, the Clerk of the County Council shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in Greenville County, once a week for two successive weeks the following information:

- (a) the results of this action of the Greenville County Council;
- (b) the fact that this Resolution does not authorize the issuance of additional bonds by the Greater Greenville Sanitation District; and

- (c) the fact that there will be no new Commission or changes made in the personnel of the present Commission of the Greater Greenville Sanitation District.
