WHEREAS, Thomas F. Parker, Lewis W. Parker, H. J. Haynsworth and David Jennings of the City of Greenville, S.C. J.H.M. Beaty of Columbia, S.C. and M.L. Marchant of Greer, S.C.

did on the 15th day of February 1911 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth: the following matters, to wit,

First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given.

Second: The name of the proposed corporation be that of PARKER COTTON MILLS COMPANY,

Third: The principal place of business of the corporation will be GREENVILLE, S.C., or near thereto.

Fourth: The general nature of business it proposes to do. being to purchase, erect, own and operate cotton mills and other plants for the manufacture of yarn and goods of cotton, linen, wool and other textile substances, and to finish and market the same and to acquire, own and dispose of stocks of other manufacturing corporations. Said corporation to have the following powers, to wit: the right to acquire own and transfer both real and personal property, including stocks of other corporations, to erect such buildings as may be needed or deemed advisable with said business, to do a mercantile business in connection in connection therewith, to develop, lease, buy or otherwise arrange for power by steam, electricity, or otherwise, and to sell, lease or dispose of such power as may not be needed for the purpose of the corporation, together with the right to light and heat the streets, ways houses and other buildings in the mill villages of the corporation; the right to borrow money and to make notes, bonds, or other evidences of debt, the right and power to endorse and guarantee the notes, bonds, stocks and other obligations of other corporations with, or without compensation for so doing, and to do all other acts and things which a corporation organized under the General Statutes of the State of South Carolina is authorized to do whether or not said matters are specifically designated herein.

Fifth: The amount of the capital stock to be ten million dollars, payable twenty per cent. Upon organization of the corporation and balance on call of the directors. And the number of shares into which the capital stock to be divided is one hundred thousand shares of the par value of one hundred dollars each, and which capital stock is to be divided at the first meeting of the stock holders for organization on two thirds vote of all stockholders into three classes, namely guaranteed

preferred, and common, having such limitations, rights and preferences respectively as are set forth in the by-laws to be adopted at such meeting, and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be
