WHEREAS, J.T. Stone, R.H. Stewart, W.A. Merritt, L.B. Houston, W.H. Griffin, J.N. Watkins, P.B. Martin, W.S. Turner, S.A. Burts, H.C. Johns and J.B. Medlock,

did on the twenty-sixth day of March, 1912, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given.
