KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That H. P. Morris, a corporation chartered under the laws of the State of South Carolina and having its principal place of business at Greenville, South Carolina in the State of South Carolina for and in consideration of the sum of \$1,450.00 DOLLARS, to it in hand duly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the grantee... hereinabove named, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto H. P. Morris, all that certain lot of land in said town of West Greenville, in Greenville County, the state of South Carolina, being lot no. 315, of a subdivision of land known as Greene Avenue Annex, represented on a plat recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds for Greene Avenue Annex for said Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book 2, page 378 and 479, and said lot containing the following lines and boundaries: Beginning at the corner of a fifteen foot alley and Greene Avenue, running thence with Greene Avenue due north 131 1/2 feet to corner of lot no. 319, then east 131 1/2 feet one hundred forty 140 feet to Broadwood Street; thence with Broadwood Street south 44 1/2 feet fifty 50 feet to main street West Greenville; thence with West Greenville north 15 feet one hundred forty 140 feet to the beginning corner, being a part of the Broadwood land, which was conveyed unto H. P. Morris by S. G. Bontner, trustee, deed recorded in G. M. L. Office in Book 22, page 69, and conveyed unto said town of West Greenville by the trustees of the Broadwood estate, deed taken on Sept. 1, 1916, recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds for Greene Avenue Annex in Vol. 40, page 250. This deed is made under and by virtue of a resolution passed by the Town Council of West Greenville, at its regular meeting on April 3rd, 1917, directing the Mayor and Clerk to execute the same unto H. P. Morris, the said H. P. Morris not having been authorized under said resolution for the consideration of seven hundred fifty \$450.00, dollars.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the premises before mentioned unto the grantee... hereinabove named, and.....

H. P. Morris..... heirs and assigns forever.

And the said granting corporation does hereby bind itself and its successors to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the grantee... hereinabove named, and..... H. P. Morris..... heirs and assigns, against itself and its successors, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

In witness whereof the said granting corporation has caused its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed and these presents to be subscribed by its duly authorized officers, J. W. Phillips, Manager and E. J. Scammon, Secretary, on this the 5th day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and in the one hundred and forty-first year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
