BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS, *H. C. Munkley, W. E. Beattie, N. C. Poe, J. E. Beattie, S. M. Mc Bee, Charles McAlister and Perry Beattie, of Greenville, S. C.* did on the *23rd* day of *September 1916* file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given.

Second: The name of the proposed corporation be that of *Piedmont Savings and Trust Company*.

Third: The principal place of business of the corporation will be *Greenville, S. C.*

Fourth: The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business it proposes to do.

*Is that of a Savings Bank and Trust Company, including receiving on deposit and paying out and leading of money, negotiating loans, acting as Trustee of Real and Personal property and all classes of securities, guaranteeing the payment of any securities or obligations sold or negotiated by or through said Company; buying and selling of bonds, notes, bonds, mortgages and other securities, acting as Executor, Administrator or Trustee of the estates of deceased persons, minors, lunatics, bankrupts, dissolved corporations and of all other kinds of estates and funds with the right and power to do all things that are usually done by Savings Banks and Trust Companies.*

Fifth: The amount of the capital stock to be *Fifty Thousand Dollars* and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be *Five hundred (500) shares* Dollars

Sixth: The capital stock to be payable as set forth in the Declaration and Petition. *of the par value of* dollars each

AND WHEREAS, on the *23rd* day of *September* 191*6* the date above named, petitioners were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators;

AND WHEREAS, the said Board of Corporators, on the *30th* day of *September* 191*6* did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing, over their signatures, certifying, among other things, that pursuant to publish notice as required in the commission of the said Corporators, the books of subscription to the capital stock of the aforesaid Company were duly opened, and that thereupon exceeding fifty per centum of the capital stock was subscribed by bona fide stockholders; that thereupon a meeting of stockholders was called, and the aforesaid Company duly organized by the election of a Board of Directors and other necessary officers. That, furthermore, they have complied with all the requirements of the Code of Laws of the State of South Carolina of 1912, and all Acts or parts of Acts amendatory thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, *R. M. McBrown* Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purpose indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Means Conveyance in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
