Wilson which fronts Stall St. on the North side, thence along a ten foot alley 170 feet to lot No.2, thence in an easterly direction along that line 69 feet to the said Wilson lot, thence along its line to the beginning and being shown as lot No. 12 on aplat recorded in plat book A. page 155, and being a part of the land of which Stephen King died seized and possessed.

To-gether with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances whatever to the said premises belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the reversions and remainders, rents, issue and profits thereof, and also all the estate, right, title, interest, dower, possessinn, property, benefit, claim and demand, whatsoever both at law and in equity of the said Stephen King and of all parties to the said suit and of all other persona rightfully claimingor to claim the same or any part thereof, by, from, or under them or either of them.

To have and to hold and said premises with its hereditaments, privileges and appurtenances unto the said John P. Wilson his heirs and assigns forever.
