Know all men by these presents: That Victor-Monaghan Mills, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of South Carolina, party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to it in hand paid by the Southern Railway Company, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release, unto Southern Reilway Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Virginia, hereinafter for convenience styled, the Railway Company, party of the second part.

A Right Of Way 25 feet in width (that is to say,  $12-\frac{1}{2}$  feet on either side of the center line of the industrial spur track of the Railway Company, hereinafter described) over and upon the land of the party of the first part, situate, lying and being at Greenville, in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina, for an industrial track of the Railway Company, which will spring from that certain other industrial spur track, now serving the business of the party of the first part, at a point thereon 2936 feet from the point of connection thereof, with the main track of the Railway Company ( which said point of main line connection is 1332 feet north of Milepost 487) and will extend thence in a westerly direction for a distance of 418 feet, more or less, of which 125 feet, more or less, will be located upon the present right of way of the Railway Company for said existing spur track and 293 feet, more or less, upon the lend of the party of the first part; Together with such additional right of way over and upon the land of the party of the first part as will be necessary at any time and from time to time hereafter, for the purpose of shifting and relocating said industrial spur track, or constructing, maintaining and operating branches or extensions thereof, to serve with shipping facilities industries located upon said land.
