This contract or agreement made and entered into at Greenville Court House on the 17th, day of Aug. 1918, between ^{Marie} ~~Marie~~ Brown the mother of Willie Earle, party of the first part, a boy of two years of age, and being anxious to make such provisions for his future welfare as enable him to make good useful citizen, he hereby agree to bind him the said Willie Earle.

The Bryson Roseman party of the second part until the said Willie Earle shall have attained his majority 21 years, and have given the custody of the said Willie Earle to the said Bryson - Roseman, party of the second part, and in consideration of above premises on the part of ^{Marie} ~~Marie~~ Brown, party of the first part and the mother of Willie Earle, I the said Bryson Roseman party of the second part do hereby agree and bind myself to take good care of, and to protect this Willie Earle until he shall have attained his majority.

To give him a good common school education, that is such as is reported or given to the children of this county, to furnish him good clothes, wholesom food, in fact to care for him as though he were one of my family, as well as to do all my power to make him a good blacksmith.

Received from Postal Telegraph Cable Co. Twenty no/100 Dollars \$20.00 in consideration of which I hereby grant unto said Company, its successors and assigns, the right to construct and maintain its lines of Telegraph, including the necessary poles and fixtures, over the property which I own, or in which I have any interest in the Township of Oak-Lawn, County of Greenville and State of South Carolina, and along the roads, streets or highways adjoining the said property, with the right to trim all trees necessary to keep the wires cleared at least eighteen inches, to set necessary guy and brace poles, and to attach to trees the necessary guy wires.

Line to be built along road and not to cut across fields any damage done to growing crops to be paid for at market value.
