 is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said

Mrs. D. J. Mitchell, her heirs and assigns; All those certain tracts of land, situated in Gant Township, in Greenville County, South Carolina, about six miles from Greenville Court House, described as follows: Tract No. 1. Twenty-six acres on West Fork of Golden Grove Creek by Saluda River, beginning at stone per pine 3x7 ft. on Kern line; thence N. 88 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 30.60 crossing said creek to a stone 3x7 ft. on a small branch on Henry Garrison line; thence S. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 8.41 with O. P. Hay line to a stone 3x7 ft. M. per dogwood, 3x7 ft. M; thence S. 85 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. Crossing Creek 31.00 to a stone 3x7 ft. on the Kern line; thence N $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 8.41 to beginning corner, being same tract conveyed to John H. Rainey by Virginia Myer and Emma Batson, deed dated March 10th, 1898, recorded in Vol. 6, p. 8, page 706, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, and conveyed to us by the said John H. Rainey by deed bearing date September 2nd, 1912, recorded in said office Vol. 16, page 57. Tract No. 2. Containing four and eighteen one-hundredths (4.18) acres, on branch of Grove Creek, beginning at a stake x3 in the Holly Springs road; thence N. 4. E. 11.60 with Thos. Osteen's line to stone x30 ft.; thence N. 82 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 20.80 to a stone 3x0 ft. west side of branch; thence S. 14 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 8.40 to corner on shoal in branch; thence down branch 2.70 to iron pin x3; thence S. 81 E. 5.34 to the beginning corner and being same tract conveyed to John H. Rainey by B. S. Granger, deed dated September 17th, 1904, recorded in Vol. 22, p. 170. Tract No. 3. Containing thirty acres, on the West Fork of Grove Creek, beginning at a stone on the John Kern line; thence N. 1 E. 9.56 to a stone 3x7 ft. thence N. 85 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. crossing said Creek 31.00 to a stone per dogwood on the Hay line; thence with said line S. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 9.5 to a stone 3x0 ft. near a dogwood; thence S. 85 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 31.65 crossing said Creek to beginning corner, being same tract of land conveyed to John H. Rainey by Jennie Myer, deed dated Feb. 17th, 1905, recorded in Vol. 22, p. 676.

Tract No. 4 containing twenty-three and three-fourths (23 $\frac{3}{4}$) acres, beginning at stake in the Grove Road; thence N. 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 21.56 to pin; thence due West 2.14 to pin, thence S. 12 W. 22.50 to pin; thence N. 85 E. 18.00 to pin in Grove Road; thence with the Grove Road 4.25 to the beginning corner, being same tract of land conveyed to John H. Rainey by L. C. Good, deed, dated October 23rd, 1905, recorded in Vol. 000, page 711. Tract No. 5. Containing Nineteen and one-half acres, beginning at pin in road; thence S. 85 W. 18.00 to pin; thence S. 12 W. 8.65 chs. to pin; thence S. 86 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 21.50 to pin in said Grove Road; thence along said road 12.10 to the beginning corner and being same tract conveyed to John H. Rainey by L. C. Good, deed dated September 17th, 1908, recorded in Vol. 12, p. 168. The foregoing five tracts of land together constitute one tract of land containing one hundred and three and one-half acres, more or less, on Grove Road, in said County and State, and all five tracts were conveyed to us by John H. Rainey by deed bearing date September 2nd, 1912, and recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds, Conveyances for Greenville County, in Vol. 16, page 57. It is hereby agreed, that the grantee herein assumes and agrees to pay two mortgages now outstanding against said property, bearing date Sept. 2, 1912.—one to M. D. Furman for \$2000 and the other to A. H. Donaldson for \$2000. Said mortgages being recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County, book 24, pages 11 and 12 respectively. Interest paid by grantors to April 28, 1914. The grantors warrant and guarantee that said mortgages or loans will be carried for a period of not less than three years if so desired by grantee.
