KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That the Warren A. Fisher, John C. Vernon,
better known as John C Fisher, and Rose Fisher his
wife, residents of Polk County, North Carolina

in the State aforesaid

in consideration of the sum of

Seven Hundred Dollars

DOLLARS,

to us

in hand paid

at and before the sealing of these presents by the Town of Tryon, a corporation
organized under the North Carolina law,

(the receipt whereof

is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said

Town of Tryon, a certain piece of land in Glassy Mountain
Township, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, lying
on the upper waters of Vaughn's Creek, being a part of
a tract of land conveyed by Mary Swain White to
Warren A. Fisher by deed dated November 29th, 1906; and
also being a part of a six hundred and forty acre tract
of land granted by the state of South Carolina to William
Fisher in the year 1851. This tract is adjacent to the
lands of the Border State Lumber Company, Warren A.
Fisher, and the Speculation Company on the North and
South Carolina State Line, and is more fully described as
follows:—Beginning at a Black Gum tree on the slopes
of Rocky Spur mountain, the old Ballard corner, the same
being a point in the southern boundary of the aforesaid
640 acre grant, and run thence N. $3^{\circ} 0' E$. 4431 feet with the
old Ballard line to a stone in the North and South Carolina
State Line; thence with said State Line S $85^{\circ} 55' E$ 420 feet
to a stone; thence S. $3^{\circ} 0' W$ 4357 feet to a stone in the
southern boundary line of the aforesaid 640 acre grant;
thence with the line of said grant S. $62^{\circ} 50' W$ 119 feet to a
stone in the place of a stump, a corner of said 640 acre
tract; thence with line of said grant S. $88^{\circ} 30' W$ 330 feet
to the beginning

Note. In the above description the courses are true
meridian bearings, the magnetic needle standing 25
minutes west of the true meridian at this date, May, 1910.
