Smith, All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate in Ward two of the City of Greenville, in County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, being a portion of Boyle's Addition to Greenville, and known as lot no. 4, of Block 10, or plat of J. T. Lawrence, D.
