KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That J. R. Stine, of the City and County of Greenville,

in the State aforesaid,

to J. H. Ambrose In hand paid

at and before the sealing of these presents by J. H. Ambrose

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said J. H. Ambrose; All that piece, parcel and lot

of land situate, lying and being in Ward 1 of the City of Greenville, and in the State and County aforesaid, beginning at a Stake 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  on the south side of Hampton Avenue at the corner of the lot now owned by Rachel Rose et al; and running thence with the line of the said Rose lot 8.55 m. 165 feet to a Stake 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ; thence S. 33 E. 50 feet to a Stake 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ; thence N. 55 E. 161 feet to a Stake on said Hampton Avenue, and thence with said Street line N. 35 W. 50 feet to the beginning point or Stake. Said lot contains 8,100 square feet, more or less, and is composed of the 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  foot strip of land that was sold to W. H. Irvine by Tower Rose and conveyed by deed dated Oct. 18, 1898, to the extent of 165 feet in depth thereof, as will more fully appear by reference to the record of said deed in the R. M. C. Office for the County and State aforesaid in Book I. T. T. at page 326, and, in part, of the parcel and lot of land in and to which Stephen King sold and conveyed the said W. H. Irvine his right title and interest, by deed bearing date, August 5, 1896, which deed is duly recorded in Book C. C. C. at page 319. Being the same lot of land conveyed to me the said J. R. Stine, by the said W. H. Irvine by deed of date the 29th day of July 1912, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. 20 at page 307.
