KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, R. B. Shumate

In the State aforesaid,
in consideration of the sum of
Four thousand, five hundred and $\frac{75}{100}$ DOLLARS,
to J. L. Johnson, in hand paid
at and before the sealing of these presents by J. L. Johnson

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release
unto the said J. L. Johnson,

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land
containing Sixty-Six and one-half (66 $\frac{1}{2}$) acres,
more or less, according to a former Survey, and
being all of that tract or parcel of land situate
in Groves Township, State and County aforesaid,
on waters of Golden Grove Creek, described
as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a stone on the
Greenville road; thence N. 55° E. 40.55 to a branch
thence down the meanders of said branch to a
stone; thence S. 23° E. 16.71 to a stone; thence S. 48° E.
77.38.50 to a stone on the Greenville road; thence
up said road N. 31° 47' W. 24.75 to beginning
corner and containing Ninety-one and one-half
(91 $\frac{1}{2}$) acres, more or less.

Less, however, a tract of twenty-five (25) acres
cut off from the above described tract and sold
to R. L. Eskew by deed of conveyance by W. H.
Cobb dated January 1st, 1913, recorded in the
R. M. C. office in and for Greenville County in
Deed Book 20, page 462.

The tract of land herein conveyed covers all
of that Ninety-one and one-half (91 $\frac{1}{2}$) acres
conveyed to W. H. Cobb by W. E. Latimer by her
deed dated December 15th, 1898 save and except
the tract of twenty-five (25) acres sold to R. L.
Eskew, and being the same tract of land
conveyed by W. H. Cobb to J. H. Dickson by deed
dated February 28th, 1914, Rec. Book 28, page 249
and being the same tract of land conveyed to
me by J. H. Dickson by deed dated May 28th,
1914 and recorded in office of R. M. C. for Greenville
County in Vol. 28 at page 574.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or
appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said

J. L. Johnson, his
