KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, J. T. Simpson of the County aforesaid

in the State aforesaid,  
 Thirty Five Hundred  
 in consideration of the sum of  
 one DOLLARS,  
 to me In hand paid  
 at and before the sealing of these presents by W. C. Phelps

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said W. C. Phelps

all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate in the County and State aforesaid, a short distance without the corporate limits of the City of Greenville, and having the following metes and bounds to wit: Beginning at an iron pin on the South side of a 20 foot street now known as Brockman Street, being the northwest corner of the property conveyed to me by S. H. Seawright, by deed dated April 11th, 1916, and recorded in R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Book 34, page 27; and running thence S. 37 W. 231 ft. to iron pin; thence S. 51 E. 204 1/2 feet to iron pin; thence N. 31-30 E. 158 ft. to iron pin; thence N. 12-30 E. 53.8 ft. to southeast corner of lot conveyed by me to S. H. Seawright by deed dated June 26, 1917, and recorded in R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Book 43, page 188; thence with line of last mentioned lot in a westerly direction 90 ft. to the southwest corner of said lot on the east side of Seawright Street, thence with the east side of Seawright Street, in a northerly direction, 96 ft. to a point on Brockman Street, the northwest corner of lot last above mentioned, thence with Brockman Street, N. 77-1/4 W. 85 ft. to the beginning corner. Being all of the tract conveyed to me by S. H. Seawright by deed first aforesaid except that portion cut from the northeast corner of said tract and conveyed by me to Seawright, by deed recorded in Deed Book 43, page 108. On the property herein conveyed there are situated fifteen dwellings.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said W. C. Phelps, his

heirs and assigns, forever.

AND myself and my do hereby bind

heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said W. C. Phelps, his

heirs and assigns, against and every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
