DEED TO C. H. Dodson

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, H. W. Shepard of Greenville County,

in the State aforesaid,
in consideration of the sum of
Nine Thousand Seven Hundred & fifty
DOLLARS,
to me in hand paid
at and before the sealing of these presents by C. H. Dodson

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, sell and Release unto the said
C. H. Dodson, and his heirs and assigns, all that certain
piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being
in the State of South Carolina and County of Greenville
in Butler Township, about 11 miles from the City of Greenville
on the west side of the road from Simpsonville to
Batesville (referred to in previous deeds as the Old
Augusta road), being composed of four separate
parcels of land which adjoin each other and constitute
one tract, containing forty-eight (48) acres, more or
less. Three of said tracts of land have collectively
the following lines, metes and bounds, to-wit:
Beginning at a stake on the west^{side} of the Old Augusta
Road, and running thence along the line of the said
and a quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) acre tract west hereinafter referred
to $8.40^{\circ} N. 6.38$ chains to a post-oak; thence $77.55 \frac{1}{4}^{\circ} N.$
 11.54 chains to a stake; thence $77.57^{\circ} N. 3.34$ chain to a
stake; thence $77.1 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} N. 21.00$ chain to a stake; thence $77.$
 $24^{\circ} E. 4.15$ chs. to a stone on road leading to the old
John Henderson Home; thence $8.42 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E. 15.33$ chain to
a stone on the Old Augusta road; thence along said
road $8.6 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E. 3.40$ chain to a stone on said road;
thence $8.3^{\circ} N. 11.25$ chain to a bend in said road;
thence along said road $8.4^{\circ} N. 9.44$ acr. to the beginning
corner, containing forty-six and three-fourths ($46 \frac{3}{4}$)
acres more or less.

The fourth of said tract intended to be hereby
conveyed contains one and a quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) acre,
more or less, and is approximately triangular in
shape and lies south east of and adjoining the $46 \frac{3}{4}$
acre tract hereinabove described by courses and
distances, being between the south end of said
tract and the Old Augusta road.

These being the same tracts of land conveyed
to me by John S. Smith by deed dated 8th day
of December 1916, and recorded in the R. M. C. office
for said County and State in Volume #41 of Deeds,
at page 469, to which reference is made.
