(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, sell and Release unto the said

Marcus Goldsmith, All that certain piece and tract
 of land lying and being situate in Greenville County
 and State of South Carolina, containing 18 acres, more or
 less, and being the same conveyed to me by H. T. Knight
 by his deed dated Dec. 20, 1918, and recorded in office
 of P. M. C. for Greenville County in deed Book 34 at page
 468, and being the same ^{conveyed} to the said H. T. Knight by D.
 A. Knight by his deed dated March 27th, 1918, and recorded
 in the office of the P. M. C. for Greenville County in Book
 34 at page 466, and being a portion of the same
 conveyed to the said D. A. Knight by M. C. Abercrombie by
 her deed dated March 4th, 1896, and recorded in the
 office of the P. M. C. for Greenville County in Book 6.6.6.
 at page 154. The land so described in the Abercrombie
 deed are as follows: All that certain piece parcel
 and tract of land situate lying and being in
 Greenville County and State of South Carolina and
 in Fairview Township, on waters of Raborn Creek and
 bounded by lands of Mrs. Jane McDowell, J. E. Farren,
 J. W. McDowell and others and beginning at a
 stone and running thence S. 86 $\frac{3}{4}$ E. 14.54 to white
 Oak thence S. 17. 4.26 to a stake; thence N. 84 $\frac{3}{4}$ W.
 14.24 to a stone; thence N. 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 14.40 to the beginning
 corner and containing thirty (30) acres, more or less
 and this conveyance covers all the above described lands
 except the following, which was conveyed by J. H. Knight
 to J. E. Rogers by deed recorded in the office of the
 P. M. C. for Greenville County in Book 15 at page 688.
 The description in the deed being as follows: All
 that certain piece parcel and tract of land lying
 and being situate in the County and State aforesaid
 bounded by lands of the J. W. McDowell estate and
 the Old Joe Wharn estate, D. A. Knight and others
 commencing on J. W. McDowell's line at a stone and
 running thence S. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 6.90 to a stone; thence S. 86
 E. 14.70 to a stone; thence S. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 6.90'; thence N. 84 $\frac{3}{4}$
 W. 14.24 to the beginning corner and containing 12
 acres, more or less.
