the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said,

King Greer and his assigns forever, the following described real estate: "All that piece or tract of land on the Rutherford Road in Greenville County, S.C. near Taylors and containing 21-15/100 acres, more or less, beginning at an iron pin on the Rutherford Road and running thence N. 56- $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 2.48 to an iron pin; thence S. 33-3/4 W. 3.18 to a stone; thence N. 47- $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 10.30 to a stone; thence N. 31- $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 3.70 to a stone; thence N. 47- $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 18.50 to a stone; thence N. 64- $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 6.70 to a stone; thence S. 47-3/4 E. 19.74 to an iron pin; thence S. 41- $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 2.63 to a stone; thence S. 48-3/4 E. 3.78 to an iron pin; thence N. 41- $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 2.68 to an iron pin; thence S. 33- $\frac{1}{2}$ W. with said road 6.20 to the beginning corner, and being tract number One assigned to Delilah Greer December 18th, 1884 in the partition of the real estate of George Greer, her husband."
