the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said

Oscar Hodges the following described real estate to-wit: "All these certain lots of land situated about two miles west of Greenville Court House, in Greenville Township, County and State aforesaid near the Morayton mills and being known and designated as Lots nos. 6, 10 and 11, on plat made by R. E. Dalton, June 7th, 1910, said plat being recorded in the R. M. C. Office for the County and State aforesaid, in Book "A" at page 409. Lot no 6 was conveyed to M. S. Staton by J. E. Burden by deed dated June 22, 1910. Lot no. 10 is part of the same lot of land conveyed to M. S. Staton by the Lawton Lumber Company by deed dated October 3rd, 1910, and lot no. 11 was conveyed to M. S. Staton by H. H. Staton by deed dated October 1st, 1910. Reference to the above plat and deeds are hereby saved for a more particular description of the lots."
