NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, That I, E. L. Luman, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Seventeen Thousand (\$17,000.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said James M. Richardson and Thomas P. Goldsmith

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said.

James M. Richardson and Thomas P. Goldsmith their heirs and assigns forever the following described real estate: All that certain piece parcel and lot of lands lying and being situated in ward 3 of the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, beginning at a point on Broad Street 50 feet from the corner of Broad and Jackson Street and running thence in an easterly direction 55 feet to corner of Donaldson's property; thence at right angles to this line 100 feet to a ten foot alley; thence in a westerly direction with said alley 55 feet to a point 50 feet from Jackson Street; thence in a southerly direction and at right angles to this line 100 feet to the beginning corner and being known as lot no. 1 in a deed made by S. P. Goldsmith and J. P. Lumber to James M. Richardson and Thomas P. Goldsmith dated Jan. 31, 1920

Also, all that certain piece parcel and lot of lands lying and being situated in ward 3 of the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, beginning at the intersection of Broad and Jackson Streets and running thence with Broad Street in an easterly direction 55 feet; thence at right angles to first line 100 feet to a ten foot alley; thence in a westerly direction with said alley 55 feet to Jackson Street; thence with Jackson Street in a southerly direction 100 feet to the beginning corner, said lot being known and designated as lot no. 1 in a deed made on January 31, 1920, to James M. Richardson and Thomas P. Goldsmith by J. P. Lumber and S. P. Goldsmith
