TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME OR BE MADE KNOWN, or whom the same may in anywise concern, I, Guy A. Gullick

of the County of Greenville in the State of South Carolina, SEND GREETING

WHEREAS T.M. Wing, as Administrator of the estate of Browning Goldsmith,

did on the 24th day of January in the year one thousand nine hundred and

thirty one file with me a Complaint in the Court of Probate, in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina against Browning Goldsmith,

in and to the effect that he was entitled to the net proceeds of the sale of the personal assets of the deceased

Browning Goldsmith,

and that he was entitled to the net proceeds of the sale of the real estate of the deceased on the 19th

day of November one thousand nine hundred and 31 when the said Court

of Probate for the County of Greenville in the State of South Carolina did Order, Adjudge and Decree that the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, should be sold to the highest bidder at public sale on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said Decretal Order, as the same may appear in the said Court's records. And the said Judge of the Court of Probate, after having duly advertised the said lands or real estate for sale to the public on the 7th day of December

in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty one

did then, lawfully and according to the custom of auctores, sell and dispose of the said real estate described below unto Elizabeth G. Goldsmith,

for the sum of Sixteen Hundred (\$1,800.00) Dollars, Dollars.

being at that price the highest bidder for same.

NOW KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said Guy A. Gullick as Judge of the Court of Probate as aforesaid, in consideration of the premises, and also in consideration of the sum of \$1,800. Dollars,

paid me by the said Elizabeth G. Goldsmith,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Elizabeth G. Goldsmith,

and her heirs and assigns forever all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land lying

in Greenville County, State aforesaid, and described as follows:

"Beginning at a point on the South side of East Earle Street, which point is 57 feet from the Southwest corner of E. Earle Street and Elizabeth Street, and running thence in a southerly direction in a line parallel with Elizabeth Street 206 feet 6 inches to a stake; thence in a westerly direction in a line parallel with E. Earle Street 63 feet to a stake; thence in a northerly direction in a line parallel with Elizabeth Street 306 feet 6 inches to a point on the South side of East Earle Street, thence with the south side of East Earle Street 63 feet to the beginning corner."

This property was sold subject to mortgage indebtedness of Four Thousand Seven Hundred Forty Five and 75/100 (\$4745.75) Dollars.
