(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold, and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said (Mrs) Mary A. Mock (Mrs) Gertrude M. Bremby and (Miss) Stella Mock, all our right, title and interest in and to all of that lot of land in Block One in the City of Greenville State aforesaid, on West Street, south side and being lot no 3 on the plat of J. T. Dickson made for John H. Houston on the 29 day of September 1889 and recorded herewith and that the following metes and bounds to wit: Beginning at a stake 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  at the corner of lot no 2 on the south side of West St. and running thence with said street N. 34 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 58 feet to a stake corner of lot no 4, thence S. 55 $\frac{1}{4}$  E. 22 $\frac{1}{2}$  feet to the back line at a stake 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ; thence S. 34 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 58 feet to a stake 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  corner of lot no 2; thence S. 55 $\frac{1}{4}$  E. 22 $\frac{1}{2}$  feet to West Street, the beginning corner. The same being a portion of a lot or lots of land deeded to John H. Houston by Isaac M. Bryan on the fifty day of January 1888. Deed recorded in R.M.C. Office Book 26 page 522. That street hereinbefore referred to is now what is known as Hampton Avenue.
