

Separation Agreement

State of South Carolina

County of Greenville

Whereas, W. Forest Thayer, hereinafter called husband, and Sarah Thayer, hereinafter called wife, were married on December 2nd, 1913, in Atlanta, Georgia, and whereas the parties hereto have mutually agreed that it is to their best interest respectively, to live separate and apart from each other, now, in consideration of the benefits to be derived to each of the parties hereto, they do mutually covenant and agree as follows: That the said husband is to have the kitchen; the bedroom set, including bedstead, mattress and springs, dresser and dressing table, together with covering for said bed; also one bedstead for the use of the husband's father; the remaining part of said personal effects and property to belong to the said wife. It is understood that "personal effects and property" as used herein applies only to household and kitchen furniture.

The said husband, hereby agreed to pay for moving the said wife to any place to which she may desire to go within a radius of one hundred (100) miles and to pay her house rent for one month.

It is understood and agreed between the parties hereto that neither the said husband nor his friends, is to interfere with the said wife, or molest her in any way, nor is he, or they, to interfere or molest the wife wherever she may get a job, and it is likewise understood and agreed that the said wife shall not so interfere with the said husband.

It is mutually understood and agreed that both husband and wife are hereby released from any and all marital obligations resulting from said marriage. In witness whereof the parties hereto do interchangeably set their hands and seals this 6th day of April, 1924.
