and to construct and maintain on and about the said premises in proper manner with poles, guywires, wires and other necessary apparatus and appliances, a line for the purpose of transmitting power by electricity, together with the right, at all times, to enter upon the said premises for the purpose of inspecting said lines and making necessary repairs and alterations therein, together with the right to cut away and keep clear of said lines all trees and other like obstructions that may, in any way, endanger the proper operation of the same.
