All our right, title and interest in and to all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate lying and being in Greenville County State of South Carolina, Chicks Springs Township, and lying on the North-eastern side of the Public Road leading from Mountain Creek Baptist Church to Taylors, S. C. and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: beginning at iron pin on line of A. H. Bridwell at corner of J. K. Bridwell and running S. 39 1/2 E. 4.28 with above named road to iron pin; thence S. 11 1/2 E. 5.80 to iron pin on edge of same road; thence S. 32 3/4 E. with road 12.49 to iron pin in edge of road; thence S. 57 E. 6.12 with road to iron pin; thence N. 56 E. 11.30 to iron pin; thence N. 32 W. 7.81 to stone across stream; thence N. 32 3/4 W. 12.50 to Black Jack A. H. Bridwell corner; thence S. 89 W. 12.31 to beginning corner, containing twenty eight and eighteen hundredths (28.18) acres, more or less, being known as the home place of the late J. W. Bridwell, deceased.

Also all that piece, parcel or tract of land lying on the South West side of the Public Road leading from Taylors to Mountain Creek Church and having the following metes and bounds to wit: Beginning at iron pin on above named road at corner of J. K. Bridwell and running S. 75 1/2 W. 12.55 to iron pin on Barnest Green line; thence S. 4 3/8 E. 7.63 with Barnest Green line to Stone, P. O. gon; thence N. 77 1/2 E. 4.33 to stone Edwards corner; thence with Edwards line N. 79 E. 6.63 to iron stake on Retherfordton Road; thence with said road N. 1 3/4 E. 8.22 to the beginning corner, containing nine and eleven one hundredth (9.11) acres more or less. Both of the above described tracts of land are parts of the same land deeded to J. W. Bridwell by J. B. Brookshire by his deed dated Oct. 22nd/1914 and recorded in Vol. 27 at page 495 in R. M. C. for Greenville County, and of which J. W. Bridwell died seized and possessed, and by his will which is recorded in the office of the Probate Judge for Greenville County in Vol. _____ at page _____, this property is left to me, Mary E. Bridwell, his wife, and W. B. Bridwell is the only other heir at law of J. W. Bridwell deceased.
