All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being on the East side of Linbergh Avenue, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina.

Beginning at an iron pin joint corner of lots Nos. 3 and 4 and running thence along East side of Linbergh Avenue S 37 W. 48 feet to an iron pin joint corner of lots nos 4 and 5; thence S. 53 E. with line of lot No. 5 113.1 feet to an iron pin on R. J. Lovelless line; thence with said lot, N. 31-13 E. 48.2 feet to an iron pin, thence N 53 W. 108.2 feet to the beginning corner. This lot being known as Lot No. 4 of the L. A. Mill property as shown on a map thereof made by Dalton & Nevis, Recorded in Plat Book "N" at page 117.
