in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release,  
unto the said Mary P. Hester, All our right, title and interest present or future in and  
to:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Paris. Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.  
containing 18 acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds according  
to a plat made by W. A. Hester, Surveyor, March 19, 1928:

Beginning at the point where the Old Buncombe Road crosses the G. & K. Railroad Tract  
and running thence with the old Buncombe Road S. 36 E. 9.78 chs. to a point in the  
center of said road; thence N. 13 E. 5 chs. to an iron pin; thence S. 47 E. 4.50  
chs. to iron pin in Little Texas Road; thence with said Road N. 13 E. 11.70 chs. to  
stone (gone); thence N. 24 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 2.95 chs. to a stake; thence N. 50 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 8.60 chs. to  
creek; thence down said creek S. 80 W. 3.75 chs. to the G. & K. Railroad tract; thence  
along said railroad tract S. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 12.30 chs. to the beginning corner. Being a  
portion of the same tract conveyed to W. C. B. Pike by F. M. Edwards by deed recorded  
in the R. A. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book III at page 470.

Also:

An undivided one-half interest in and to that other certain piece, parcel or tract  
of land situate in Paris Mountain Township, County and State aforesaid, bounded by  
lands of Hawkins Ashmore, G. & K. Railroad tract, containing 18 acres, more or less,  
and being a part of the tract known as the H. L. (Tobe) Batson, tract.
