Ashmore Delinquent Tax Collector of and for the County and State aforesaid, in consideration of the premises, and the sum of Fourteen and 52/100 (\$14.52) Dollars to me paid by the said grantee Charlie Dill have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, sell, bargain and release unto the said grantee Charlie Dill, his heirs and assigns:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, in Greenville Township, near Woodside Cotton Mill and in the subdivision known as "Donwood" and being known and designated as lot number sixty-eight (68) on plat of said subdivision made by R. E. Dalton, engineer. Said lot fronts on Iola Street fifty (50) feet and runs back a depth of one hundred and fifty feet and has such courses and distances as are shown on said plat.

Together with all and singular the Rights, Members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

To Have and to hold all and singular the premises hereby granted, with the appurtenances, unto the said Charlie Dill his heirs, and assigns, forever, according to the form in force and effect of the laws and usages of the State of South Carolina in such cases made and provided.
