C. F. Putman, his heirs and assigns forever.

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in.....Grove Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.
containing $5\frac{1}{2}$ acres more or less adjoining land now or formerly owned by Cunningham, Earl, and others and being the same tract of land conveyed to George Green and Mary Green by John Higdon Dec. 13, 1922. Said deed being recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 88 at page 11. Reference to which is hereby craved. The said George Green having subsequently conveyed his interest in said tract of land to Mary Green by deed recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 107 at page 17. And the said Mary Green died intestate having surviving her as her sole heirs, George Green and Nellie Francis. Being the first parcel or tract of land described in the first Paragraph of Deed to S. B. Frances from George Green and Nellie G. Frances and recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Book 204 at page 262, and being the same property conveyed to me by E. J. Belcher by his deed dated 2nd day March 1942 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. 243 at page 38 far a more complete description.

Also one half undivided interest in all that certain tract of land in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, Cleveland Township, on waters of Saluda River, joining lands of J. W. Moody, Haynesworth and Co. James Williams and Mrs. Codys and others. Containing 200 acres more or less, and known as the Chris Turnes Place.

Beginning at a stone and running N. $2\frac{1}{4}$ 3/4 E. 6.90 to a stone thence N. $60\frac{3}{4}$ E. 6.90 to a red oak; thence N. $1\frac{1}{2}$ E. 11.70 to stone; thence N. $12\frac{1}{4}$ W. 6 to post oak stump; thence N. $21\frac{1}{3}$ E. 8.90 to stone; thence N. $2\frac{1}{2}$ E. 6.70 to stone; thence N. $77\frac{1}{2}$ W. 25.25; thence S. $37\frac{3}{4}$ W. 15; thence $75\frac{5}{6}$ W. 15.88; thence S. to P.
