in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said William Ira Sullivan

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, having the following metes and bounds, courses and distances:

Beginning at a stake on St. John Street (100 feet east of Green Ave.) being the corner of a lot sold to D. Winbush, and running in a northerly direction fifty-nine (59) feet more or less, to lot known as Bowen's lot, thence in an easterly direction, along/same, in a southerly direction fifty-nine and one-third (59 1/3) feet, to St. John Street, thence along said street, in a westerly direction, fifty (50) feet, more or less, to the beginning point, and being the eastern part of the same lot conveyed to me and G. L. Calhoun by D. A. Lykes, by deed dated Feb. 21, 1907; said G. L. Calhoun having conveyed his interest in the same to me by deed dated Mar. 3, 1915.
