KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That We, J. T. Burgess, G. R. Harris and Pierce Conwell, as Trustees of the Judson Methodist Church

in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Five and no/100 (\$5.00) DOLLARS

to us paid by B. R. Turnipseed, B. B. Black and D. W. Smith, Trustees of the Anderson Road Methodist Church

in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said B. R. Turnipseed, B. B. Black and D. W. Smith, Trustees of the Anderson Road Methodist Church

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being at the southwest corner of the intersection of Anderson Road and Honour Street in Judson Mill Village, Greenville Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, being known and designated as a portion of Lot No. 90 and an unnumbered lot adjoining same, on map of Section No. 5 of Judson Mill Village made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, February 1940 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina in Plat Book "K", at pages 33 and 34 and having, according to a survey made by R. E. Dalton March 1943, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin at the southwest corner of the intersection of Anderson Road and Honour Street, and running thence with the northwest side of Anderson Road S. 45-37 W. 175 ft. to an iron pin, thence N. 51-12 W. 175 ft. to an iron pin, thence N. 45-37 E. 175 ft. to an iron pin on the south side of Honour Street, thence along the south side of Honour Street S. 51-12 E. 175 ft. to the beginning corner, being the same lot deeded by Judson Mills to the Trustees of the Judson Methodist Church October 20, 1943 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 257, page 421.

Pursuant to Paragraph 254 of the 1944 Discipline of the Methodist Church we hereby consent to the transfer of the property herein described.
