

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, } BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.
EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, SAM GOLDBERG and Thelma Goldberg,
both of Greer, S. C.,

did on the 19th day of September, 1947, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is RICHARD AND COMPANY, INCORPORATED

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greer, S.C.,

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is a general merchandising, wholesale and retail, buying and selling as agent, commission merchant, broker, factor or otherwise, exporting and importing, manufacturing and distributing, of dry goods, textiles, notions, incidentals, novelties, cosmetics, foods, clothing, hats, shoes, furniture, household and office furnishings, equipment and supplies; also, to make investments, finance, and buy, sell and rent real estate.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars,
payable in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is twenty-five (25) Dollars.
of the par value of One Thousand (\$1,000.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 16th day of September, 1947, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:
Sam Goldberg and Thelma Goldberg

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Sam Goldberg
as Vice-President, Thelma Goldberg; as Secretary, Thelma Goldberg
as Treasurer, Sam Goldberg

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
