 do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said William C. Graham

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Cleveland Township, Greenville  
 County, State of South Carolina Adjoining lands of Furman Pritchett, Charley Laws,  
Florence Story,

BEGINNING: on I.P. on Settlement Road thence running N 85 E 1.00 chs to  
 bend in road, thence S 47 E 2.30 to I.P. in fork of road thence N 75 W 2.31  
 chs. I.P. thence N 13 W 3.33 to the beginning corner and contains 52/100  
 of an acre, more or less.

Also, all that piece parcel and lot of land lying, situated and being in  
 Cleveland Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina afore said
