

company-owned houses of Judson Mills, and containing 47.35 acres, more or less, and lying on the South side of the Easley Bridge Road extending back Southwardly to Sixth Street and bounded generally by Third and Fourth Streets on the East, and by Second Avenue on the West. The boundaries of said parcel may be described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Easley Road and Fourth Street at the Northernmost point of this parcel, thence Southeastwardly along Fourth Street to the junction of Fourth Street with the extension of Third Street and A Street, thence Westwardly along said extension of Third Street, Southwardly along Third Street to Fifth Street, thence Westwardly along Fifth Street to Neubert Avenue, thence Southwardly along Neubert Avenue to Sixth Street, thence Westwardly along Sixth Street to Second Avenue, thence Northwardly along Second Avenue to Easley Road, thence Northeastwardly along Easley Road 1258.2 feet, more or less, to the beginning corner.

2. Those three certain lots of land at the intersection of Easley Bridge Road and Fourth Street, fronting on the Northeast side of Fourth Street, a total of 212.4 feet, more or less, and extending back to the Northeast to Brushy Creek and particularly described as Lots 1, 2 and 3 on a plat of Section 6 of Judson Mills Village made by Dalton and Neves, Surveyors, dated November, 1941, and recorded in the office of Register of Mesne Conveyance in Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book K, at Pages 106 and 107.

3. That certain strip or lot of land 20 feet in width extending Northeastwardly from Fourth Street to Brushy Creek, a distance of about 212 feet and being the area shown between Lots 10 and 11 as shown on said plat of Section 6 of Judson Mills Village, upon which lot is located a pump house.

4. Those two certain lots on the Eastern side of E Street bounded on the East by Brushy Creek and being particularly shown as Lots Nos. 19 and 20 on said plat of Section 6 of Judson Mills Village.

5. That certain tract or parcel of land containing 4.65 acres more or less bounded on the East by Valentine Street (formerly George's Road) for a distance of 813.5 feet, on the South by Maloy Street, on the West by Brushy Creek and on the North by property now or formerly of H. K. Townes.

6. That certain parcel or lot of land on the North side of Fifth Street particularly described as Lot No. 108 upon the aforementioned plat of Section 6 of the lands of Judson Mills.

7. That certain parcel or tract of land containing 5.62 acres, more or less, lying South of Fifth Street and on both sides of Maloy Street and described by courses and distances as follows: Beginning at a point in the center of the bridge on Maloy Street crossing Brushy Creek, thence S 72-10 E 80.4 feet, thence S 56-27 W 554.3 feet, thence N 54-06 W 225.8 feet, thence S 51-08 W 192.5 feet to a point on the Northern side of Seventh Street, thence N 1-42 W 109.2 feet, thence
