The grantors further reserve to themselves, their heirs and assigns, the right and easement in perpetuity to go upon the land for the purpose of maintenance, operation, and repair of the above-mentioned pipe and electric transmission lines as the same are now located, to remove and relocate said lines or construct other lines so that the lines as so relocated or constructed will run in, under or above any part of said land and to operate and maintain the lines as so relocated or constructed. The grantors further reserve to themselves, their heirs and assigns, and to the public, the right and easement to go from the street upon which the said lot fronts to any well or water supply which be upon the land herein conveyed.

AND WHEREAS, said provision was inserted in said deed through mistake as such reservation was intended to apply only to the village of Conestee and,

WHEREAS, Lindsay J. Forrester, Jr. is now the owner in fee simple of the property over which these rights were reserved,

NOW THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Henry P. Willimon of Greenville, South Carolina, do hereby release, and forever relinquish and do hereby bargain, sell and release all my right, title and interest in and to the reservation cited above unto Lindsay J. Forrester, Jr., his heirs and assigns, forever.
