CHARTER  
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

C. V. RICHBOURG, ANDERSON, S. C.  
K. J. RICHBOURG, ANDERSON, S. C.

did on the 29th day of August, 1952, file with the Secretary of State, a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is SUPPLY SALES COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, sell, trade and deal in, at wholesale and retail, groceries, provisions, feeds, supplies, merchandise as are or may be sold in a general store, and to conduct a general grocery and general merchandise mercantile business, to lease, buy and otherwise acquire real and personal property; to lease, sell, mortgage and dispose of same and to do all things subsidiary, necessary or convenient for carrying out and to effect the main purposes and objects of the organization of the corporation and the furtherance of the mercantile business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars payable on call of the Director, in cash or its equivalent.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is 100 (one hundred) of the par value of One Hundred (.100.) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the shareholders will be held on the 19th day of August, 1952, at which a majority of the stockholders present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: C. V. RICHBOURG and K. J. RICHBOURG.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected a President, C. V. RICHBOURG; as Vice-President, K. J. RICHBOURG; as Secretary, K. J. RICHBOURG; as Treasurer, C. V. RICHBOURG.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 150, Code of Laws of South Carolina, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, so far as they relate to the filing of the articles of incorporation by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent of the capital stock, before presentation of the same to the Secretary of State, and public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State, has been given in the *Greenville News*, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amending the same, do hereby certify that the aforesaid Corporation is lawfully organized to do business in the State of South Carolina, and I do hereby direct that a copy of this charter be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall do business.
