and remove the timber hereby conveyed and to use and exercise the rights, privileges and easements hereby granted. Title to so much of said timber and trees as remain on said lands, either standing or fallen, at the expiration of said eighteen months unless extended by the terms of the agreement, shall immediately revert to and become the property of the Grantor, her heirs and assigns.

And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Georgia-Pacific Plywood and Lumber Company, its successors and assigns, against myself and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
