

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That...I. James William Smith ....... in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of . Four Thousand and No/100 - - - - - -by ..... Ellis M. Johnston .... (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said. Ellis M. Johnston, his heirs and assigns, forever: All that lot of land with the buildings and improvements thereon situate, on the Southeast side of Elford Street in the City of Greenville, in Greenville County, S. C., having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the southeast side of Elford Street, said pin being approximately 70.5 feet northeast from the southeast corner of the intersection of Elford Street and Thompson Street, and running thence along the Southeast side of Elford Street, N. 47-00 E. 35 feet more or less to an iron pin at the corner of lot now or formerly belonging to Sarah Terry, and running thence with Terry line, S. 12-00 E. 72.5 feet more or less to an iron pin in line of property now or formerly of the Estate of Genia Black; thence S. 76-00 W. 31 feet to an iron pin at corner of lot now or formerly of Harrison Deal thence with line of Deal property in a northerly direction, 56 feet more or less to the beginning corner.

This property was conveyed to my father, James W. Smith, by deed of William G. Sirrine, dated March 24, 1919, which deed is recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Book 29, Page 189. Subsequently the said James W. Smith died intestate as will more fully show by reference to Apartment 248, File 21 in the Probate Court for Greenville County, leaving as his sole heirs at law his wife, Lina Smith, and his two children, James William Smith, and Hattie Smith (later Hattie Smith Lewis). Thereafter the said Lina Smith died intestate as will more fully appear from Apartment 382, File 26, on file in the Probate Court for Greenville County, S. C., leaving as her sole heirs at law her two children namely the Grantor, James William Smith and Hattie Smith (Hattie Smith Lewis). Thereafter the said Hattie Smith Lewis died intestate, as will more fully appear from Apartment 430, File 14 in the Office of the Probate Court for Greenville County, S. C., leaving as her sole heirs at law, her husband, Robert Lewis, and her brother, James William Smith. The interest of the said Hattie Smith Lewis, in the above property, was subsequently acquired by the Gramtor, James William Smith, by deed of E. Inman Master for Greenville County, dated April 10, 1942, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Book 244, Page 31.
