pany. Only one (1) residence shall be served from a tap.

The water shall be used for household purposes only which, however, will include the watering of lawns. The water shall not be used for swimming pools or other like purposes and shall not be used for business establishments or industrial plants.

After a pipe has been installed upon the premises of each member of the company, a test shall be made by the members to determine whether it will be feasible to permit other taps on the Water Main. If it shall appear that the water supply and the pressure shall be sufficient to permit additional taps, without impairing the adequacy of the supply and pressure to the members, the members shall agree upon the number of taps which may be added without impairing their own supply. The number of additional taps must be agreed to by at least five (5) of the members and the number of taps thus agreed to may be sold if the officials of the Greenville City Water Works shall concur in the opinion that the supply and pressure of water to the members will not be impaired by such additional number of taps. If it is determined that additional taps are to be permitted, the same shall be sold at a price and on terms to be agreed to by at least five (5) of the members. The pipes to be installed from each such said tap shall not exceed three-fourths: (3/4) of an inch in diameter. The purchasers of said taps shall have no interest in the Water Main. If it is determined that seven (7) or more taps may be sold, each member shall be entitled to designate a purchaser, but if an application is made to the company for the purchase of a tap and no member shall designate such applicant for the purchase within ninety -(90) days from the date of the application, such applicant may be sold a tap if five (5) of the members shall approve the sale and thereafter the members shall not be entitled to
